The layout size was 15' by 27', with ample room around it. This is spite of the fact that at the last minute we added two modules to the space we had asked for. The Bristol S-Guagers are a good outfit to deal with, even though this is only their second show. The scenic impact of the layout was excellent, as we had 23' of one 27' long side with mountain division. Mike Boucher brought a new 4-foot module, unfinished as yet, but showing great promise. It was tested before the show and set up and ran with no problems. There was ample time to run trains, as practically all of those who came were those who had brought modules.

According to the organizers, there were 200 dealer tables. Walking around, it seemed that a high proportion had at least some N scale for sale. Also, I seemed to hear a lot of remarks from people who were attending the show indicating interest in N scale. There were 10 layouts in various scales, although ours seemed the best scened. Attendance was over 1000, about the same as last year. Attendance might have been a little higher but for the rainy weather and Palm Sunday. This is a good show for us to attend.


## Newsletter & Activities
