NYS&W Railroad
150th Anniversary

The weekend of October 16th and 17th the NYS&W Railroad celebrated the 150th anniversary of the Railroad. They had a mixed train of passenger cars pulled by a steam locomotive with diesel assist. The train traveled from Binghamton to Syracuse, New York. We followed the train staying ahead of it 90% of the time.



We started the day in Binghamton at the Canadian Pacific yard. We saw one train arrive and one go through. The weather was not cooperating for us, we would have periods of rain followed by sun. Later that day we went to the Dewitt yard in East Syracuse. If you have ever been to Selkirk and were disappointed by not being able to see any action, Dewitt is for you. There is a 5 mile long road that parallels the east end of the yard. Plus there is a signal bridge and a grade crossing. In an hour we saw 5 freight trains and 2 passenger trains.



The next day we spent 4 hours at the Amtrak Station in Syracuse. In the time we were there we saw 10 freight trains and 2 passenger trains (Buffalo Bills Express and the east bound Lake Shore Limited). The freight trains averaged 80+ cars. They sure move a lot of freight in the area. I hope to go back there in the summer and hopefully have better weather.

Returning to NYC from Boston following Thanksgiving Day I went looking for evidence of a rail/freight station in Webster MA. The Worcester- Norwich line had been built about 1835 and passenger service lasted until about 1970. My track profile diagram for the Providence & Worcester RR (P&W) suggested a location by the very absence of symbols for a station, road crossing, signals or detection devices. Here was a blank space bearing only the name "Webster" at a great location right off the north side of Main Street, about 500 feet long, more than adequate for an early passenger train. What did I find? A large, long and wide, partly cobble-stoned open space. The single track of the P&W Norwich line and fenced off from that a single isolated track with a collection of rolling stock which included the GE (?) Ton diesel-electric as re-habed by the P&W Railfan Club in New Haven colors. Also seen was the P&W caboose which is apparently the Club's HQ. There may be evidence of the old structures which I did not search further for. I was pleasantly surprised to find this well cared for equipment.
