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# Winterfest 2009

It is time to start getting excited about Winterfest 2009, the 15th Annual Northeast NTRAK Convention, January 23 - 25, 2009. The convention will once again be held in conjunction with the annual "Big Railroad Hobby Show" of the [Amherst Railway Society](#) (ARS) at the Eastern State Exposition grounds ("The Big E") in West Springfield, MA on January 24 - 25. This is undoubtedly the largest annual model railroad show in New England and became the largest in the U.S. last year by adding a 4th building of layouts, exhibits, manufacturers and dealers. The show usually has an attendance of around 20,000. Winterfest 2009, planned to be much the same as last year, will feature model, module, and photo contests, clinics, full capacity layout operations (including DCC), and a memorable Saturday evening banquet.

Our convention hotel, again this year, is the [Hilton Garden Inn](#), centrally located just off Interstate 91 in downtown Springfield. The hotel, located at 800 West Columbus Avenue, is across the side street from the [Basketball Hall of Fame](#) and only minutes from "The Big E" and the Springfield AMTRAK Station. A convention rate of \$85.00 plus tax (currently 12.45%) per night has been negotiated, single or double occupancy. Reservations should be made before January 5, 2009 by calling **800-774-1500** or **413-886-8000**. Please identify yourself as a member of NTRAK to get the special convention rate. After January 5, hotel reservations will be accepted on a space and rate availability basis only. There is ample free parking at the hotel for registered guests. Other accommodations in the area with special train show rates can be found at [www.amherstrail.org/show/accommodations.htm](http://www.amherstrail.org/show/accommodations.htm).

The Better Living Center building at "The Big E", will be open after 1:00 PM on Friday for layout set-up activities. Those who do not bring modules but plan to run trains should also plan to share in the fun of meeting and working with new and old friends to set up and test the layout. Please try to have all modules in place, clamped, and connector tracks installed before 5:00 PM Friday. There will be no charge for parking during set up on Friday. Please read the article titled "[Winterfest Layout Operation](#)" which is applicable again this year. The hotel will be available after 4:00 PM for check-in. The Convention Registration Desk will open at 7:00 PM in the hotel conference room area just off the main lobby. A series of entertaining and informative clinics will begin at 7:30 PM near the registration desk. Again this year, there will be a \$5.00 charge for parking at "The Big E" on Saturday and again on Sunday for the train show. The ARS (and, therefore, we) will **NOT** be selling the parking hangtags in advance. However, "The Big E" will be selling hangtags, on Friday, which provide unlimited entry/exit on show days at a cost of \$10.00.

Everyone must have a badge issued by the ARS to gain entry to the show buildings on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Adult admission to the show for the public is \$10 per day or \$18 for a two-day ticket. However, all Winterfest registrants receive an "exhibitor badge" because they each bring modules, trains and equipment; help set-up or take-down; and/or contribute to the operation of the layout in some way. Registered spouses and children should be especially aware of the privilege of having an "exhibitor badge" in addition to their Winterfest badge. This year ARS plans to print names on the "exhibitor badges" before distributing them based on the list of names I provide to them before January 13, 2009. To obtain your badge, you must stop at the Show Office on Friday after 1:00 P.M. as you arrive for layout set-up and say you are part of the "NTRAK layout". The Show

Office is located just inside Door #7 at "The Big E". If you don't arrive until Saturday, the badges will be available at a booth just outside Door #7. The ARS "exhibitor badges" will not be distributed as part of Winterfest registration on Friday night as was done in the past.

On Saturday morning convention activity will shift to "The Big E". Please arrive early to help with track cleaning and final testing so a full set of long trains will be rolling when the doors open to the public at 9:00 AM. Be sure to help fill all the slots on the sign up sheets. We need 3 trains on the Blue Line, 3 trains on the Yellow Line, 3-5 trains on the Red Line under DCC, a Layout Supervisor and 3 Tower Operators for each hour of operation. [Model Contest](#) and [Photo Contest](#) entries will be received from 8:00 AM until 10:00 AM. We have improved the online model and photo contest entry forms that should be filled out online and printed for each of your contest entries. We will also have some paper copies of the forms at the registration desk for last minute entries. Train operation at the layout will continue all day and will include the "Parade of Trains" best-train-in-show competition to be held from 1:00 to 2:00 PM. **Note:** Voting in the model and photo contests **must** be completed before 2:00 PM.

Saturday evening activities at the convention hotel will begin at 6:30 PM with an "Attitude Adjustment Period" featuring a cash bar, hot hors d'oeuvres and a digital slide show. The banquet this year will feature a tossed garden salad with dressing, your choice of Sliced Roast Sirloin with Mushroom Demi-Glace or Chicken Françoise with Lemon Butter Sauce, potato and vegetable, rolls and butter, and dessert. Water, coffee or tea will be served with the meal. The cash bar will remain open for the duration of the banquet. The price for the banquet and appetizers (probably Stuffed Mushrooms, Spring Rolls and a Mixed Cheese Plate), plus our usual entertainment, awards presentation, updates from manufacturers and exceptional camaraderie is again just \$32.00 per person this year. A special meal is available for children under 12 for \$10.00. Everyone at the banquet will receive a large coffee mug with the Winterfest 2009 logo. Extra mugs will be available at \$5.00 each while the supply lasts.

Northeast NTRAK has commissioned **Micro Trains** to produce a [special run covered hopper car](#) commemorating 25 years of model railroading excellence. The club car is painted in B&M blue with bright white graphics. The cost of each car is normally \$29.00 plus \$7.50 for shipping and handling per order for up to 6 cars. The car is being offered to Winterfest 2009 registrants as part of the online registration process at a special price of only \$27.00. The car will be available to layout visitors during the show for the regular price of \$29.00. Again this year, there will be an opportunity to purchase a commemorative Winterfest 2009 T-shirt for \$15.00. Shirts must be ordered and the size (S through XXL) must be chosen prior to January 1, 2009 as part of the online registration process. This year, the shirts are black with bright white lettering. Shirts and special run cars will be handed out at the Winterfest Registration Desk on Friday evening.

On Sunday the focus returns again to "The Big E" for more excitement and team effort to keep the layout operating at full capacity. Of course shopping and seeing the rest of the show is always an option. Please pick up model and photo entries at 3:00 PM. Layout take down and farewells will wrap-up the convention

activities after the show closes at 5:00 PM.

We encourage you to bring your best modules for our module contest. If you are planning to bring a module, please contact the Layout Coordinator, [John Dunne](#) at 508-697-7635 as soon as possible to reserve your space. New modules, with completed scenery, are encouraged but should be thoroughly tested at other shows, prior to use at Winterfest. We plan to run DCC (Digitrax) on the Red Line, so bring your DCC equipped motive power and radio throttle.

I know it is difficult for some people to arrive Friday afternoon for module set-up or to stay until the show ends on Sunday at 5:00 P.M. I also know it takes extra effort to haul, set up, and take down another module in addition to bringing your best module. However, it is very important to maintain the tradition of promoting NTRAK by completely filling our allotted 30' x 80' layout space! Therefore, to encourage more people to bring modules, a "Module Raffle" will be held again this year for those who bring modules. About 10 "better" prizes will be distributed during the banquet on Saturday night. One Module Raffle ticket will be given out at the layout on Saturday for each 4' of modules that is in the show layout. For example, a person with a 3' corner or a 4' straight module in the show layout gets one ticket; an 8' module gets 2 tickets; a 16' yard gets 4 tickets; a 6' plus 2' set of modules gets 2 tickets; etc. The more modules you bring, the better your chances of winning a special prize.

Full registration for **Winterfest 2009** is again just \$32.00, \$27.00 if your registration form and payment is received before January 1, 2009. There will be a \$4.00 registration charge for spouses again this year. Children under the age of 16 are free. Older children and other adult family members must register separately. It is essential that you register online. If you don't have web access, please ask a friend to help you register online.

In summary, save the dates for Winterfest 2009; make your hotel reservations **now**; call the Layout Coordinator **now** to reserve space in the layout for your module; fill out the online registration form and mail in with your check promptly to finalize your registration; finish up those potential prize winning models for the model contest; spruce up your best module for the module contest; decide on your best train to run in the "Parade of Trains" contest; print and frame those great pictures you took recently (no repeats from previous years please); start packing a variety of trains to help keep the layout running at capacity; think about how you can personally contribute to make Winterfest a little bit more enjoyable for everyone else this year; and then get totally psyched to help make Winterfest 2009 a really fun time for everyone!
