
President's Message Frank Dignan

National Heritage Museum Show Wrap Up By Bob Pawlak

Mark Ferracane, Bob Fallier, Frank Dignan, Roland Kelley and Peter Matthews brought and set up modules Friday afternoon. That made it possible for these same people to finish their set up and then help others set up on Saturday morning. Dan Pawling, Devin Afshin, and Peter Matthews brought the rest of the modules Saturday morning. Ron Wood, Peter Matthews' wife and children Brian and Ashley were much appreciated extra hands for set-up. The four-wheel carts, provided by the museum, were also very helpful. As a result, test trains had run, the mainline tracks were clean, the curtains and yellow rope were up, and the first complete train was running just before 10:00 A.M. as the first visitors were let into the room.


The layout this year consisted of a 23' by 23' square (one 4' corner and three 3' corners with the two 1' bridge modules) which is the smallest layout we have had at the Museum Show. Two members with 8' straight and 12' straight modules were in Florida and another member with 12' straight was on a family vacation. Other regulars were unable to participate for one reason or another. The Red Line was DCC for part of the time and the Yellow and Blue Line were DC using just one throttle for the relatively small loop. Bob Fallier's 4' corner and two other 4' adjoining modules with the Disney castle theme together with Roland Kelley's 8' circus module were the highlights of the layout.

We ran long trains of auto racks, double stack container cars, tank cars, mechanical reefers, covered hoppers, coal cars, and mixed freights. We ran fully-lighted classic passenger trains such as the Burlington California Zephyr and Southern Pacific Daylight. A variety of bullet trains and an interesting assortment of European trains were also run. Of course Thomas the Tank and his friends also made periodic appearances throughout the two days.

With the two-wheeled carts and everyone helping, the room was empty and clean and everything was out of the museum by 4:55 P.M. after the show ended at 4:00 P.M. on Sunday. Then all vehicles were loaded and gone by about 5:15 P.M. This year there was no need to temporarily store modules or equipment for later pickup.

Attendance was definitely hurt by the snow which accumulated on Saturday afternoon but was better than last year when it snowed and was cold and windy.
