Playing Nice

Let's face it; we all want to do it at least once: just come to a show and have the modules magically functional and set up, so we just run our trains and go home. Nice, but it doesn't work that way. We've all joined a club for fun, but fun comes with some responsibilities. So beginning this Fall, here are some basic expectations we will all share:

- We'll all help our Show Coordinators by responding quickly when the call goes out for modules for a show.
- If you're coming with a module, come at the time asked for and help set up not only your own module, but help others too so everything can be set up before the doors open. Show Coordinators are looking for those coming to a show to help put in connector tracks, cleaning track, set up the DC and DCC power cords, hang skirting, clamp modules together, and check that all is level and plumb. Many hands make light work!
- If you don't have a module for the show, but plan to come run trains, we still need you to help run the railroad: plan to help set up or take down, or take a turn as a tower operator. We need you to do more than just run your train and leave, and if we find that's all you do, don't be surprised if you're not running a train at the next show. Remember too that those who brought a module, those who helped set up or break down at the end of the show, and those who have served an hour or more as tower operator will have first dibs on when they operate.
- To run a train, sign up on the train signup schedule, and then be there on time! If we're using the 16' yard, there are shelves at each end to enable you (continued on page 4)

2015 Annual Meeting Notes by Geof Smith

Larry Lockwood hosted the 2015 Annual Meeting at the club house of his townhouse association in Millbury, MA, on Sunday, May 31. We enjoyed good food, and a spacious, comfortable setting, followed by a layout tour of Larry's impressive home layout. A special thanks to Larry and his wife for their hospitality!

Those present elected new officers for the 2015/2016 year: Geof Smith as President; Bob Fallier as Vice President; and Bob Pawlak was re-elected as Treasurer. A special shout out to Frank Dignan for serving this past year as President. Show Coordinators volunteered (or were volunteered), and the list of shows will be published in this and future newsletters. Please take note that T-trak and MaiNtrak shows will be included in the schedule this year – so even if you can't bring a module, please do help out by lending a hand for these shows. They help us set up, operate, and break down, and we should do the same for them.

Mark your calendars now for a module clinic and tune up session planned for Saturday, October 3, from noon to when we're thrown out. This will be held at the middle school in Pepperell the day before the show. This is your chance to make sure the electronics and track on your module meet club standards and are show-ready. Once the electronics are checked out, you'll also have the chance to get help working with DCC, scenery, or any other aspects of your module you'd like an extra set of hands or eyes to help with. Even if you're not planning on your module being part of the Pepperell show, you need to come to this and get your module tuned up and checked out!

Even if you can't participate in the show on Sunday the 4th, please attend the workshop/tune-up on Saturday. If your current module(s) has Cinch-Jones connectors, we would like to either add or replace them with the current standard Power Pole connectors. Bob Fallier will work with you. Please let us know well in advance so that we can purchase materials. The cost for Power Poles is marginal, about \$7.50 for Red/Yellow/Blue/White connectors, and \$9.00 including Green, to replace Cinch-Jones. Call it an even \$10 to add 6" jumpers with Power Poles and you can use either C-J or Power Poles for hook up. Bob will check for proper polarity on all modules with Power Poles. An easy way to remember which end is which: "The color is always **Right on Top**" - obviously on the bottom on the left.

to set up and take down your train quickly and safely.

Feel free to use this space, but then clear your containers for the next person.

- Like the real railroads, if you're running a train, stay with your train! Don't walk off to tour the show. Be ready to deal with derailments and stop or start your train when needed. The equipment you save may be your own!
- If you're a tower operator, don't abandon your post! Wait for your replacement and tell them of any problems you've seen on your shift.
- If a guest to the show is touching the layout or otherwise creating a hazard (it seems adults often are more grabby than kids), ask them politely to stop. We want to encourage folks to enter the hobby, not make it seem like it's run by old grumps.
- Come help MaiNtrak or Ttrak set up or take down at a show they're running. They do this for us!

The more helpful to each other and create a fun and relaxed atmosphere, the more folks who come to shows will want to join us. Thanks for listening.



High Speed Rail Travel in Tawan

Above is a picture of the Taiwan high-speed hourly express trains on the scenic eastern line. From late 2007 the new 'Taroko express' high-speed (130km/h) electric tilting trains were introduced, providing an hourly service between Taipei and Hualien, with several services continuing along the scenic valley to Taitung.
